Australia and the Armenian Genocide

Three speakers, in this order, followed by questions and discussion:

Dr Deborah Mayersen is a Senior Lecturer in International and Political Studies at UNSW Canberra (ADFA). Her publications include *On the Path to Genocide: Armenia and Rwanda Reexamined* (Berghahn Books, 2014), and most recently the edited volume *A Cultural History of Genocide in the Modern World* (Bloomsbury, 2021). Deborah will be speaking about the onset of the Armenian genocide, and why Armenian Genocide Memorial Day is on 24 April, the day prior to Anzac Day, each year.

Vicken Babkenian is an independent researcher for the Australian Institute for Holocaust and Genocide Studies. He is the co-author (with Peter Stanley) of *Armenia, Australia and the Great War* (NewSouth, 2016); this will be the title for his talk.

Prof Peter Stanley, Research Professor at UNSW Canberra (ADFA), one of Australia's most active military historians, will discuss how the Armenian Genocide - or rather the Genocide of the Armenians - connects with the broader history of genocide in the twentieth century. He'll be asking how the understanding of this genocide - and how it has affected Australia - has changed over the past century, and how we should think of it today in a multi-cultural Australia.
